

## President's Message

In December some of our members participated in the Batch Foundation Gift Wrapping Community Service coordinated by the Allegheny Chapter. As the Batch coordinator was speaking to us, she stated that one of our goals for the day was to make a new friend, so our group of PghASR members split up and worked with volunteers from other community groups that were there that day.

I have to admit, I was not one of them. I chose to stay with members of our group – because to be honest - there are many in our group that even though we all worked for the Pittsburgh Public Schools – I would like to get to know them better.

In an article published by the New York Times called 10 Ways to Keep Your Mind Healthy in 2025 (Caron & Smith, December 30, 2024) the ninth strategy is – well, I'll just copy and paste, you can read it yourself.

#### 9. Make a new friend.

Feeling lonely and isolated can harm our mental health, and it may change our brains, too. In fact, there's a growing body of research showing a link between loneliness and Alzheimer's disease. Experts think that may be because loneliness triggers the body's stress response, which increases inflammation. Over time, chronic stress and inflammation can damage brain cells and the connections between them, which can contribute to dementia.

To combat loneliness, reach out to a friend or family member — even a short phone call can have a powerful benefit. If you want to make new friends, joining a club or support group is a good place to start. Look for ones that tap into a shared identity, like for widows or new moms, advised Dr. Ellen Lee, an associate professor of psychiatry at the University of California, San Diego; that can give you something immediate to connect over.

As the article suggests, “if you want to make new friends, join a club ... look for ones that tap into a shared identity ... that can give you something immediate to connect over.”

That is exactly what the Pittsburgh Association of School Retirees has to offer you, we have a shared identity that can give you something immediate to connect over. When I first joined PghASR I would attend events hoping to reconnect with folks I knew well because we had worked together for years. Often, I would leave disappointed because either there was no one there that I had worked with or there was no time to socialize with those that I did know. But maybe, this was the wrong way to approach my participation in PghASR. Maybe I should have been thinking about attending PghASR events in the hopes of making new friends. An opportunity to get to know someone with a shared identity – something we could immediately connect over – our work and love for the Pittsburgh Public Schools.

We all know that anyone who worked for PPS for possibly 30+ years has to be someone special – someone to get to know better. I recently attended a wine tasting at Mary's Vine in Rankin ... I looked across the room and recognized someone from PghASR. Of course, we had to re-introduce ourselves but I have to tell you that getting to know that person and her husband better, made the difference between a wine tasting and a special evening. So maybe instead of thinking about attending a PghASR event in the hopes of reconnecting with an old friend perhaps think about attending in the hopes of making a new friend.

# Member Spotlight on William A. G. Fisher

What does one write about a person who has inspired many, both in education and beyond? This writer is inspired by William Fisher! We are members of St. Paul Baptist Church and when he wants to, I drive him to church every fourth Sunday. A “young” man who has lived a century and still imparts wisdom, is kind, thoughtful, and humorous. A man who has truly inspired many!

When you look back over Mr. Fisher’s life and career as an educator, you will find that all has brought him to this moment and place in time. He was born in Pittsburgh on June 22, 1924. He graduated from the old Peabody HS. He enrolled in the University of Pittsburgh, but his education was cut short because he was conscripted to serve in WWII. He returned to campus in 1946 and completed his degree. But it wouldn’t be until 1955 that he would receive his first position as a teacher at Pittsburgh’s former Fifth Avenue HS, a predominantly Black school on the Hill. Between 1948 and 1955, Mr. Fisher worked as a clerk and manager for the PA. Unemployment Office in the Hill District.

It was his commitment to working at Fifth Avenue that led to his storied career in public education. He was the first to teach a class in Black History in the district and to create a parent-teacher organization at a city high school. By his second year of teaching, he had received the Edgar Stern Award for being one of the 10 best teachers in the city.

Mr. Fisher spent 13 years teaching at Fifth Avenue. During this time, he attended Duquesne University, where he earned his master’s degree in education.

After his time at Fifth Avenue, he went on to serve as vice principal at Westinghouse HS. He later returned to Fifth Avenue as principal. He held this position for two years before going to Allderdice in 1971.

In 1971, racial tensions were evident not only in the city, but in some schools. Allderdice was one such school. Mr. Fisher had to grapple with racism, his first day which was marred by a group of students chanting for the Black principal to go back to Fifth Avenue.

Mr. Fisher was not deterred! He forged through it all by setting high expectations for students and staff, while being a welcoming presence that the teens would come to support and go to when things went wrong. His perseverance and dedication paid off, under his tenure Town and Country Magazine listed Allderdice as one of the seven best integrated U.S. high schools.

He has influenced his former students so much over the years. Students still send him birthday cards. It is not an anomaly for him to get 100 cards or more from students all over the U. S. The Class of 1974 celebrated their 50th reunion last year and celebrated Mr. Fisher’s 100th birthday at the same time. It has also been an ongoing tradition of Mr. Fisher attending Allderdice reunions.

His former students have many stories about the infamous principal. The two that most students recalled were Mr. Fisher chasing students who tried leaving school early and bringing them back, and him receiving the nickname, “The Hook.” It was reported that he had a very low tolerance for students who wore their hats in school. It didn’t take long for the students to realize that if they didn’t take their hats off that piece of clothing would be confiscated and hung on a hook in Mr. Fisher’s office. He set high standards for the school and its students, and the expectation was that the standards set would be followed.

One former student wrote, “He was just amazing in his ability to keep the peace and yet he was able to command the respect of a loving uncle or someone who you respected in your family.” Another student was quoted as saying, “He treated people the same no matter where you came from, what you looked like, and he gave out what he expected back in which was just basic respect.”

Mr. Fisher has inspired many! His century of wisdom, kindness, educating young people, and his high regard for excellence has made him an asset in his community, his church, and most importantly in the hearts of people who have had the privilege to walk alongside him in some way and be a benefactor of all his knowledge.

## Information about the Guest Speaker for the Region 12 Spring Luncheon scheduled for Thursday, May 1st at the LeMont Restaurant.

The Guest Speaker will be Cyndie Carioli a Senior Justice Advocate for the Allegheny County District Attorney's Office. Ms. Carioli is an experienced and trained professional working with and addressing the particular needs of older adults throughout Allegheny County. Collaborating with senior service providers and law enforcement, she works to promote awareness of elder abuse and supports senior victims of fraud, abuse and neglect. Ms. Carioli has been working with and advocating for seniors for nearly two decades. She has been a Senior Center Director, has been nationally certified as an Information & Referral Specialist in senior services and is passionate about protecting older adults from abuse.

Cyndie's topic for the luncheon specifically will be, "RED FLAGS – Learn How to Avoid Becoming a Victim of Scamming & Fraud". Older adults in Allegheny County have become targets for scamming, fraud and abuse. Ms. Carioli's presentation will summarize the reasons for this trend and detail the kinds of elder abuses the Allegheny County District Attorney's Office has investigated, prosecuted and is working to prevent. 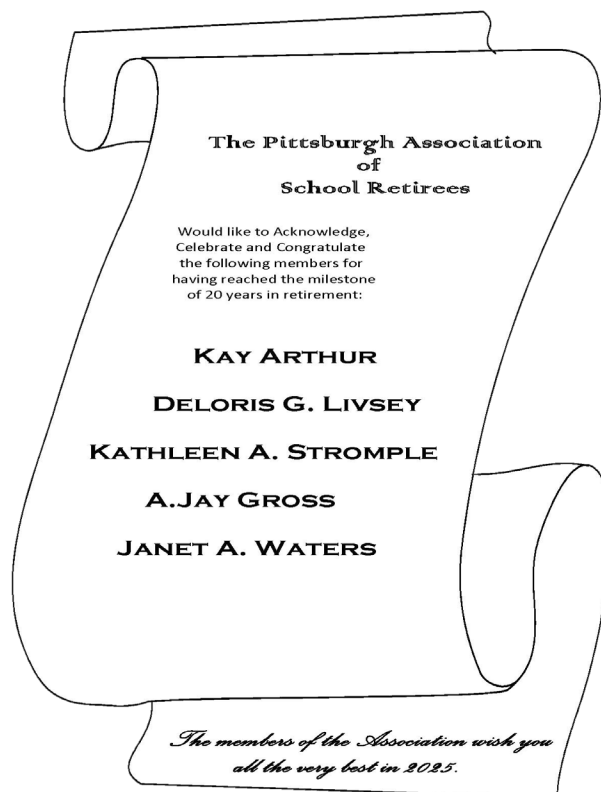

## Make Your Life Easier with a PSERS Interaction Account

### Dr. A. Jay Gross, Recording Secretary

If you are a retired professional employee of the Pittsburgh Public Schools, who retired between 1988 and 2008, every February you are entitled to receive a reimbursement payment to help cover the cost of your Medicare Supplement Premiums. To receive the payment, you are required to submit a Benefits Statement from HOP/PSERS (or other insurance provider) listing your monthly payments toward your Medicare Supplement Premiums. Every year we are at the mercy of HOP/PSERS to get the Benefits Statement in time to submit it to the Board in order to qualify for reimbursement. Now we no longer have to be at the mercy of HOP/PSERS to get this form. Go to the PSERS website at <http://www.psers.state.pa.us/interaction/default.htm> and set up an INTERACTION ACCOUNT. You will be able to get information and print ALL forms – including the Benefits Statement form and 1099 Tax Form – earlier than you receive them by mail from HOP/PSERS. Do it now and remember it next tax season!

## Are you ready for Medicare?

You are nearing 65 and may have wondered what you are going to do regarding your health care insurance as the Board will no longer provide that coverage for you. The good news is that you are now eligible for Medicare and also HOP (Health Options Program) which is provided through PSERS and is designated for retirees and their dependents and survivors. As a Medicare supplement, HOP offers a number of options for medical coverage from which you can choose. Several months prior to your 65th birthday you will receive a packet from HOP. Included in that packet will be the health options that you can select from as well as information about the dates, times and locations for group information meetings. It is always advised that you attend one of these information presentations. If you are still not fully able to make a decision you can request a one-on-one meeting with an advisor at PSERS. Getting your supplemental or Advantage plan through HOP has a number of benefits. HOP provides a \$100 per month premium assistance which is applied to the cost of the plan that you choose. The plans that are available through HOP provide very comprehensive medical coverage and prescription drug plans. The cost of the HOP plans are very competitive with locally available plans and often offer greater coverage at a much better rate. The cost of the HOP plans are automatically deducted from you pension benefits, assuring you uninterrupted coverage. Another benefit is that during the annual selection period an individual may choose to change their plan option without penalty. In addition there is always HOP personnel available to answer your questions about coverage and make recommendations. If you have access to the internet go to the HOP web site at [www.hopbenefits.com](http://www.hopbenefits.com) where you can read more about the coverage through HOP.

## **PASR Region 12 Report**

### **Robert Marko, PASR Region 12 Director**

It is with a heavy heart that we mourn the death of PASR Region 12 Treasurer Joe Poerio. Joe was an active member of the PGH-ASR and he served as Treasurer of PASR Region 12. We send his wife Paula and his family our sincere condolences, Dr. Ron Dufalla has consented to serve as the Region 12 Treasurer.

During the PASR-L/PEC meeting on Wednesday, February 19, 2025 we were informed that Allegheny County State Representative Dan Deasy will again sponsor a new bill in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives for a Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) for public school employees who retired from service prior to 2000. This bill will have a new number because it is a new legislative year. We will be asking all PASR members and friends to contact their Legislators and request support for this new legislation. We are also working to have this legislation become part of the 2025 Pennsylvania state budget.

Please note that as of January 31, 2025 pre Act 9 retirees now need \$176.58 to purchase goods that would cost \$100.00 on July 1, 2002, the last effective date of the previous COLA paid to public school retirees who were employed in Pennsylvania.

I hope that each of you will give some time to communicate and meet with your member of the Pennsylvania House of Representative and your state Senator to discuss the desperate need for a COLA for our elderly public school retirees.

Please remember that the PASR legislative team members were able to get the Pennsylvania State House of Representatives to pass COLA Bill H. B. 1416 in 2024, but the State Senate did not release it from the State Senate Government Committee. We need to make sure that the new house bill is passed in the House of Representatives and then work to get the bill passed in the State Senate.

I will provide the number of the new COLA bill as soon as it is released from Representative Deasy's office.

## **Spring 2025 COLA UPDATE from PASR**

Efforts to promote lawmakers to adopt a COLA for pre-Act 9 beneficiaries continue in Harrisburg. House members Rep. Steven Malagari and Rep. Dan Deasy have again introduced legislation to support retired school employees. The bill – House Bill 411 – is now in the House State Government Committee awaiting consideration. The legislation mirrors the proposal led by these two lawmakers last session, which passed the state House twice with significant bipartisan support. As we all know, no action was taken in the state Senate.

PASR and its lobbying team at Triad Strategies are continuing to work with lawmakers to advance this bill. These efforts are also being supported by groups like PSEA and AFSCME.

All parties continue to stress the imperative nature of the COLA. With inflation continuing to rise, pre-Act 9 PSERS beneficiaries are seeing the values of their pensions decline with each passing day. PASR and Triad are actively working on a new “fact sheet” for advocacy distribution to lawmakers to help encourage their support. That material will be made available in the near future.

Outreach efforts on the COLA are continuing in the state Senate, especially with members who have outwardly expressed their support of the concept. Sen. Katie Muth and Sen. John Kane have again issued legislative co-sponsor memos with plans to introduce COLA bills similar to those they sponsored last session.

It will remain imperative for PASR members and retirees to reach out to their local elected officials and advocate for advancement of the COLA plan(s). Two decades are far too long to wait for this support.

### How to Access the PghASR Website
